I have laid before Lord
Glenlyon, your letter of the 9th Inst. with the Copies
therein enclosed, of a Letter and of its enclosures,
from Rear-Admiral. Sir J. B. Ramsay, on the
subject of Mr Stewart's Scheme of colonization in
the Falkland Islands.

Lord Glenlyon, having already
expressed his opinion, that Mr Stewart might be
allowed to proceed to the Falkland Islands, for
the sole purpose of bringing away his moveable
property, directs me now to request you will move
the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, to
intimate to Rear-Admiral. Sir J. B. Ramsay, to
intimate to Mr Stewart, that His Majesty's
Government are resolved not to allow him to
engage in pasturing Cattle, or in catching Fish
in the Falkland Islands; and that if he
should attempt to engage in either of those
operations he would be forthwith removed
from thence, together with his moveable property.

In the event of Mr Stewart having
proceeded to the Falkland Islands; and refusing
to remove himself, or his property, the Rear-Admiral
Sir John B. Ramsay, should

should, therefore, direct that Mr. Hincks's removal
be effected by the use of such force as might
be indispensable for the purpose, but taking
the utmost care that no unnecessary injury
be inflicted on his person or property. -
