

I Gilbert Davison declare that con-
sidering the Schooner Harriet to be in company
with the Schooner Superior by virtue of an agree-
ment signed on the 8th of this present month
of September, and for the more faithful ac-
complishment of my obligations therein mentio-
ned do bind myself hereby upon oath, first
not to endeavour to release the Schooner
Harriet in any unlawfull manner, but pea-
cably to submit that said Schooner be sent to
Buenos Ayres to stand her trial; secondly,
not to do any thing either by word or deed
(while on this Island and while on the Voyage
to Buenos Ayres), that can tend to disturb
the peace of this place or of the Schooner,
or that can any way tend to counteract
the measures that the authority of this
Island may think proper to adopt in the
execution of the laws of the country. Port
Louis tenth day of September 1831.
