I have much pleasure in making your acquaintance by the enclosed letter from my Old Friend, Wm Langdon, <sup>that</sup> ~~it~~ <sup>is</sup> ~~not~~ he has there stated, I fully confirm, & from my connections &c. have no doubt of success: I have already (in addition to Langdon who will send a flock &c &c.) several first rate persons, anxious to cooperate with me: but there must be no limit, as to time, & this day. Langdon legally &c &c. conveyed his grant to me, & shall at once set to work: I expect to hear from you by the very first possible occasion, confirming to me, my Heirs, or Assigns for ever, the said Grant, &c. - stating also, your wish to join in, & mutually promote the desired object to the fullest extent. This will satisfy any one who may be

sceptical, as to your reciprocity, &c. and  
will be more likely to induce the  
Government to <sup>send</sup> out convicts, for our  
works, &c. in which your advice and  
directions may there be useful. This will  
be one of my main objects, with the Govt.  
to enable us to have Labourers, for their  
food only; as in Van Dieman's Land! —

As you must have various sorts  
of produce, &c. which would sell to great  
advantage here, I advise you to send  
me by first vessel touching, or via Buenos  
Ayres, which I will dispose of for your use,  
or our use; returning the proceeds in  
such articles as you may direct, for our  
use &c.; you might send any quantity  
of Whalebone, Hides, Hairs, Skins &c.  
particularly Seal & Rabbit? —

To show you that I am in good earnest  
& having three Brothers in my establishment  
I would in order to pave the way for our  
ulterior proceedings, immediately on receipt  
of your reply, send out one of them to you  
providing you would hold out any Penâ-
