To Sir Graham Eden Hamilton



Sir,

I am in possession of your Communication to me of the 27th August, stating that you have received orders from the Lord Commissioners of the Admiralty that no claims on my part to the property of the wild Cattle on the Falkland Islands must be admitted arising from a grant real or supposed of the B. A. Government, nor any Seigneurial right to the fishery. — I can not help thinking these orders to be founded upon an erroneous view of ^{my} case and ^{confidently} expect this matter will be rectified when a Memorial which I addressed on the subject to Lord Viscount Palmerston may have come to hand. Meanwhile I would respectfully beg to be informed, whether said Communication to me is to be looked upon as an absolute prohibition or whether I shall be permitted to continue it upon my former until this matter is finally decided —
