Received by the last packet your letter of March, and considered that the best thing I could do with it for the benefit of your Interests as well as for the Settlement of the questions under the Consideration of H. M's Gov^t, was to send it to the Secretary of State:— This I have done with my own opinion that if there be any idea of promoting Colonization in the Falkland Islands your Experience may well qualify you for the task of reestablishing a Colony there which I have little doubt would ultimately under British Protection become a very useful one to shipping bound round Cape Horn:— I can

do no more unless the King's Government should think
 proper to consult me on the matter when
 I shall only repeat the same Opinions. -

I regret to hear that your affairs are in
 so unsatisfactory a state: - Have never
 heard of Mr Wittington or of the Company to
 which you allude as being in project I suppose
 from yourself. - Believe me to be Dr. Sir
