Sir,

I have received directions from
Viscount Palmerston to acquaint you,
that His Majesty's Government do
not object to your proceeding to the
Falkland Islands for the purpose of
taking away the private property
which you may originally have
deposited in those islands, upon
condition, that you do not remove

To at the same time any of the native

cattle from the islands. and I am
further instructed to inform you that
any steps which you may take
beyond the removal of your private
property will be considered as
amounting to a trespass on His
Majesty's rights, and will make it
incumbent on His Majesty's Naval
Officers to treat you as an intruder
on the property of the Crown.
